# Winner of major Melbourne sculpture prize revealed

- The winner of the \$60,000 Melbourne Prize for Urban Sculpture 2023 one of the most valuable prizes of its kind in Australia, has been announced at Fed Square this evening.
- The winner, Maree Clarke, has been inspirational in helping to nurture and promote the diversity of contemporary south-east Aboriginal artists.
- The artistic calibre of all four finalists reflects the abundant and diverse talent in the state.
- Winner of the Civic Choice Award 2023 will be announced on 16 November.

Today, the winner of one of Australia's most valuable and prestigious sculpture prizes has been announced – the \$60,000 Melbourne Prize for Urban Sculpture 2023.

### **Congratulations to MAREE CLARKE**

Maree Clarke, a Mutti Mutti/Yorta Yorta and Boon Wurrung/Wemba Wemba woman from north-east Victoria, has been instrumental in the reclamation of southeast Australian Aboriginal art practices, reviving elements of Aboriginal culture that were lost – or lying dormant. A pivotal figure in the Victorian Indigenous art scene since the 1990s, Maree has emerged as a leader, helping to nurture and promote the diversity of contemporary south-east Aboriginal artists. Maree's public art, sculpture, painting, and multimedia installations of painting and photography explore the customary ceremonies, rituals and language of her ancestors.

The 2023 judges include three esteemed arts sector professionals: **Emily Floyd** artist, **Kate Ten Buuren** Senior Curator, First Nations, Melbourne Arts Precinct and **Katharina Prugger** Curator of Contemporary Art at the National Gallery of Victoria.

Supported by Major Patron, **The Vera Moore Foundation**, the **\$60,000 Melbourne Prize for Urban Sculpture 2023** has been awarded to Maree Clarke to provide direct professional development opportunities. This year entrants were asked to provide information on how the Prize funds would be used on clearly defined initiative/s or project/s that will develop the entrant's practice, building on their previous professional work.

Supported by **Fed Square**, the sum of \$1,000 plus a \$1,000 Qantas voucher is awarded to the finalists who do not take out the major prize. Public voting closes today at 5pm at <a href="https://www.melbourneprize.org">www.melbourneprize.org</a> for a finalist to win the **\$2,000 Civic Choice Award 2023**.

An Augmented Reality Finalists' Exhibition showcasing the four finalists has been on show at Foundation Events Partner, Fed Square and closed at 9pm today. The AR exhibition and 2023 design identity is by <u>Playground</u>.

Now in its 19th year, the annual Melbourne Prize recognises and rewards excellence and talent among Victorian writers, musicians and sculptors. The Melbourne Prize for Literature will be offered in 2024.

**Melbourne Prize Trust Chairman, Janine Kirk AO** said, "the prize has been well received this year by the local artist community and I want to thank all entrants and congratulate the four esteemed finalists and the winner."

The Trust's Founder and Executive Director, Simon Warrender OAM said, "the judges had an extremely challenging task this year due to the impressive calibre of entries, and I appreciate their dedication and the support of all our partners, who have made it possible to offer the program this year."





The annual Melbourne Prize current cycle includes this year's Melbourne Prize for Urban Sculpture, which will be followed by the Melbourne Prize for Literature (2024) and the Melbourne Prize for Music (2025).

### Notes to the editor:

The <u>Melbourne Prize Trust</u> was established in 2004 to recognise and reward talent, excellence and inspire creative development. The Trust achieves this aim by running the annual Melbourne Prize, which is funded by private and public sector partnerships and patrons. The Melbourne Prize Trust and annual Melbourne Prize were founded by Executive Director, Simon Warrender.

In its 19th year and being one of the most valuable arts prizes of its kind in Australia, the annual Melbourne Prize operates in a three-year cycle, including the Melbourne Prize for Urban Sculpture (2023), the Melbourne Prize for Literature (2024) and the Melbourne Prize for Music (2025).

Since inception, the annual Melbourne Prize has made available more than \$2 million in prizes, residencies, equipment grants and an annual public exhibition and presentation at Fed Square to showcase Victorian writers, sculptors and musicians.





The origins of the Melbourne Prize Trust date back to *The Magic Pudding* sculpture commission and children's garden concept at the <u>Royal Botanic Garden Melbourne</u> – an initiative of Simon Warrender implemented in 1998 through Committee for Melbourne's Future Focus Group. The limited-edition miniatures of this sculpture have now sold out.
